The LLG is available to provide financial support to enable members to participate in learning opportunities such as short courses, workshops or conferences related to their continuous professional development and the promotion of the profession. You could even apply to use the grant to attend the 2024 Annual RCOT conference on the 12 - 13 June!

You can apply now for a grant up to £200. If successful, we'll ask you to write a short reflection on your course (around 200 words) for the regional newsletter.
